

THIS WEEK ON LAKE JOCASSEE APRIL 7, 2025

LOON TIME! Time to leave us. that is. Spring loon migration is in full swing. On some days in the early predawn you can hear Loons hooting over most of the lower basin. On other days, the lake can be hauntingly quiet, like it was this past Tuesday morning when we saw only 10 or 12 loons. Such is the nature of spring migration. But on Wednesday morning loons were everywhere. Clearly the loons arrived late that Tuesday afternoon. And for Friday and Saturdays' beforesunrise sojourns, the heavens had clearly rained And loons. Bonaparte's gulls, and Redbreasted mergansers, Coots by the hundreds. It has been a nearly overwhelming couple of mornings, the kind of mornings you must remind yourself to breathe, as loons fly right above your boat. The loon research is done for the year, soon followed by the loons. The two remarkable loon scientists, Dr's James Paruk and Mager, and all the loon lovers and professionals, here from Florida to Maine to Colorado. They are all gone. There is a deep and certain sadness to the end of all this, as there is a certain sadness at the end of each season. And yet a certain joy too, as the seasons change

BLOOM TIME: On Tuesday, we did a tour under blue skies that show abundance of an wildflowers blooming. These included Flowering Dogwood, Downy Serviceberry, Mountain Silverbell, Oconee Bell, Canada Violet, Faded Trillium, Vasey's Trillium, and a new discovery that I learned the ID of the next day with Keith Bradley's class. This was Sand-myrtle, Kalmia buxifolia. This turns out to be the 2nd documented location in upstate SC of this rare species to SC. Wednesday added more flowers including Sweet White Violet, Doghobble, and Witchalder. The coves added singing Out on the lower warblers. basin were hundreds of loons with many flying off only to return since they had visibility over a hundred feet or I think most had dropped out of migration due to the weather impact days. We added a lone Osprey and a couple of Eagles to boot. Join in on all the excitement and get out there! ~Dan Whitten, JLT guide

DID YOU KNOW?

Kalmia buxifolia is a species of flowering plant in the family Ericaceae known by the common name sandmyrtle. It is native to the mid-Atlantic and southeastern United States, where it has a disjunct distribution, occurring in three separate areas. It is only known from the Pine Barrens of New Jersey, the Coastal Plain of the Carolinas, and the southeastern Blue Ridge Mountains.

ABOUT THE BLUE WALL

Spanning three states (North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia) and encompassing 859,000 acres, the Southern Blue Ridge Escarpment, known as the 'Blue Wall' by Native Americans, contains some of the highest natural diversity of rare plants and animals found anywhere in the world.
