Last week I had the privilege to observe a phenomenon I've seen play out time and time again. Public tours for JLT often result in people from diverse backgrounds on the same boat - two, three, sometimes four or more separate family units. At the beginning, one can often sense the hesitancy. Who are these strangers I'm about to spend the next few hours with? Will it be awkward? Will this be a waste of time? However, almost without exception, conversation inevitably ensues, common ground is discovered, and, over the course of just a few hours shared in the enchantment of what we call Jocassee, connections are made. In conservation biology, one of the hallmarks of ecosystem health is diversity. DID YOU KNOW?

Evening civil twilight begins at sunset, and ends when the geometric center of the sun is 6 degrees below the horizon. Under these conditions absent fog or other restrictions, the brightest stars and planets can be seen, the horizon and terrestrial objects can be discerned, and in many cases, artificial lighting is not needed.

In general, the term nautical twilight refers to sailors being able to take reliable readings via well known stars because the horizon is still visible, even under moonless conditions. Absent fog or other restrictions, outlines of terrestrial objects may still be discernible, but detailed outdoor activities are likely curtailed without artificial illumination. ~weather.gov

Spanning three states (North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia) and encompassing 859,000 acres, the Southern Blue Ridge Escarpment, known as the 'Blue Wall' by Native Americans, contains some of the highest natural diversity of rare plants and animals found anywhere in the world.
