Noticing November

Float around a bend of mountain dipping into the clear waters of beautiful Lake Jocassee. Witness beech, birch, and sourwoodcadmium yellow, raw sienna, and Indian red—dancing a sexy tango. Here, Breeze is light, blocked by Mountain, and ki carries wood smoke fragrance from a nearby campfire. Round a point towards Valley Horsepasture and the movement of air picks up,

funneled through deep and narrow gorges. Watch the graceful waltz of swaying oak trees, dressed in seasonal burnt umber and raw ochre. A flash of brilliant white circles above the lake: gulls are here; loons are arriving. Taste this sweet ephemeral autumn in the gooey persimmons that linger on our lips and fingertips. Jocassee Gorges are as beautiful now as they ever will be (until next season) and if haven't you witnessed this for yourself, come. ~K

THIS WEEK ON LAKE JOCASSEE NOVEMBER 10, 2025

Chances are if you've been out given with we've us. vou something seasonal to taste while you're on the boat. It's very common for us to offer guests a sour apple flavored leaf from a sourwood tree, a wintergreen twig from a sweet birch, or a sunwarmed muscadine grape. now, American persimmons are ripe and dropping onto the forest floor, providing much needed nutrients for bears, foxes, and deer. These animals are building their fat reserves for the coming winter. According to the Old Farmers Almanac, you can even predict how severe winter will be by cutting open a persimmon seed and looking at the shape of the seed embryo. If you see a fork, winter will be mild, a knife means sharp cold that cuts right through you and a spoon, well, you guessed it... you'll be shoveling some snow this year. We've been tasting the ones we can reach and so far, each seed we've opened has a spoon. Personally, I'd love to see a good snow. And like these animals, I hope to be curled up in my den, snug, warm and watching it as it peacefully falls on the Jocassee Gorges. DID YOU KNOW?

"Objectification of the natural world reinforces the notion that our species is somehow more deserving of the gifts of the world than the other 8.7 million species with whom we share the planet.
